

## Media Connections

Presenters take note: if you plan to use any form of electronic or multi-media projection, **it is your responsibility to ensure your software and hardware are compatible** with the equipment available at the host institutions. Please arrive early before your session to run an equipment check.

**The computer projection systems at both Washington and Lee University and Virginia Military Institute have Windows-based computers installed in every conference room.** We recommend that presenters with Windows-based slides bring their presentation on a USB drive. Web connections are available, but we recommend that presenters explore more reliable alternatives to a live internet connection.

If you intend to bring your own **Macintosh** laptop, then **bring your own VGA connector**. *If you plan to use your own vintage laptop, you must bring your own vintage connector.* Carefully read the connectivity description for your venue.

The following technical descriptions are provided for your information.

### Washington and Lee University, 24-25 March

WLU wireless info: you will receive login information in your conference packet.

Elrod Commons 345 – Has an installed projector with a native resolution of 1024 x 768 (4:3 format). Has a VGA hookup for laptop and a resident Windows laptop.

Stackhouse Theater (in Elrod Commons) – Has a high resolution projector but the laptop connection is set to run at 1024 x 768 since that is a widely compatible format. Has a VGA hookup for laptop. Has a resident Windows computer.

Washington Room (in Evans Hall) – Has a portable projector on a cart; the projector is native 1024 x 768. Has a VGA hookup for laptop and a resident Windows laptop.

Hillel 101 – Has wide screen 1280 x 800 resolution with a VGA connector for laptops. Also has HDMI connector for laptops. Has a resident Windows computer.

### Virginia Military Institute, 26 March

Scott Shipp Hall 301/2, 401, 501, and 502 – Each has a SmartClassroom podium with a resident Windows computer on the VMI network; the resident computers have USB connectors for thumb drives.

Scott Shipp Hall 519 – Has a projector with VGA hookup and a resident Windows laptop. The laptop has a USB connector for a thumb drive.
